Notification for Inviting Applications from Schools for the Establishment of Self-Financing Student Police Cadet (SPC) Units

The Police Department, on behalf of Government of Kerala, invites applications from Government, Government-Aided, Private Aided and Un-aided High Schools and Higher Secondary Schools interested in implementing the Student Police Cadet (SPC) Project as Self-Financing Units.

The prescribed application form is available on the official website of Kerala Police: **www.keralapolice.gov.in**

The duly completed application, signed by the Head of the Institution, may be submitted through e-mail to the SPC Directorate at "**spcprogramme.pol@kerala.gov.in**" on or before **5.00 PM on 10 July 2026**.

In addition, the original application, along with all supporting documents, shall be submitted to the District Nodal Officer of the Student Police Cadet Project concerned. The duly completed Annexures I, II, III and VI are to be attached to the application.

Further, Annexure IV, along with a copy of the duly filled application form, shall be submitted to the jurisdictional Police Station concerned.

All the above formalities relating to the submission of applications shall be completed on or **before 5.00 PM on 10 July 2026**. Applications received after the prescribed deadline or applications that are incomplete in any respect will be summarily rejected and will not be considered for selection.

Eligibility Criteria, Terms and Conditions

1. The School intending to initiate the Student Police Cadet (SPC) Project shall have a minimum strength of 100 students in Class VIII or Class XI and an actively



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functioning Parent-Teacher Association (PTA).

2. The school should nominate two permanent teachers as Community Police Officer (CPO) and Additional Community Police Officer (ACPO) respectively for leading and coordinating the project, two High School teachers in the case of High Schools and two Higher Secondary School teachers in the case of Higher Secondary Schools. The nominated teachers shall be below 50 years of age, physically and mentally fit, healthy, alert, active, possess a child-friendly attitude, and be willing to participate in SPC training programmes and related activities. In Schools having girl students, at least one of the nominated teachers, either the CPO or ACPO, should be a female teacher. The nominated teachers shall undertake to implement the SPC curriculum and activities in accordance with the guidelines issued by the SPC Directorate from time to time.

3. The School should nominate two retired Police personnel to serve as Drill Instructors for the Student Police Cadet (SPC) Project. The nominated instructors shall be below 65 years of age, physically and medically fit, and capable of effectively imparting parade, drill, discipline, and outdoor training to the cadets in accordance with the guidelines of the SPC Directorate. In Schools having girl students, at least one of the nominated Drill Instructors should be a woman.

4. Playground for physical activities, room for setting up SPC office and a separate & safe room for cadets for changing SPC uniforms and PT dress are other mandatory requirements.

5. The Schools selected pursuant to this notification shall be considered only for the establishment of Self-Financing Student Police Cadet (SPC) Units. The selected school shall open a joint current account in a nationalised bank for the operation and management of SPC funds. The account shall be jointly held by the Head of the Institution, the Headmaster in the case of a High School or the Principal in the case of a Higher Secondary School, and the Station House Officer (SHO) of the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the school is situated. The Head of the Institution shall be the first account holder, and the Station House Officer shall be the second account holder.

6. An amount of ₹5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakh only) shall be deposited into the joint current account opened exclusively for the Student Police Cadet (SPC) Project on or before 10th May of every year to ensure the continuation and effective implementation of the SPC Project during the ensuing academic year commencing in June. Failure to remit the prescribed amount within the stipulated time may result in the discontinuation of the SPC Unit or such action as may be decided by the SPC Directorate.

7. The Student Police Cadet (SPC) Units established pursuant to this notification as Self-Financing Student Police Cadet (SPC) Units shall not be eligible for any financial assistance, grant, or funding from the Government, either under the SPC Project or under any other scheme, unless otherwise specifically ordered by the Government. The institutions concerned shall have no right, claim, or entitlement,



either present or future, to seek or demand Government funding, reimbursement, or financial support for the functioning of such Self-Financing SPC Units under any circumstances.

8. The Applications submitted with faulty claims and declarations would not be considered for the SPC Project in any case.

9. The applications submitted by Schools will be reviewed and scrutinised by the Station House Officers (SHOs) of the concerned Police Stations and District Nodal Officers (DNOs) of the SPC program.

Schools that have already submitted applications for the initiation of the Student Police Cadet (SPC) project must be required to resubmit their applications for consideration under the scheme for the establishment of Self-Financing Student Police Cadet (SPC) Units. Previous applications submitted for regular SPC Units should not be considered under this Notification unless resubmitted in the prescribed manner.
