All India Police Badminton & Table Tennis Cluster Tournament Concludes in Kochi

The first-ever All India Police Badminton and Table Tennis Cluster Tournament came to a close at the Rajiv Gandhi Indoor Stadium, Kochi, following five days of intense competition and spirited camaraderie.

The closing ceremony was graced by State Industries Minister P. Rajeev, who served as the chief guest, along with State Police Chief Dr. Shaik Sheikh Darvesh Saheb and other senior officials.

Uttar Pradesh emerged as the overall champions in Table Tennis, while Mizoram claimed the top spot in Badminton. Minister P. Rajeev presented trophies to the winners and took the salute during the ceremonial march-past.

Contestants who delivered outstanding individual performances were honored with awards, while all participants demonstrating notable efforts received prizes and commendations.

A total of 1,033 police personnel from across India — including members of various State Forces and Central Armed units — took part in the event, which highlighted physical prowess, discipline, and unity among the forces.

Organized by the All India Police Sports Control Board, the tournament featured 43 teams, including 825 male and 208 female athletes, representing different regions of the country.
