Cheetah Vehicle Patrol on Road;

30 Traffic Sectors in the City

Kerala Police introduced Cheetah Vehicle Patrol to put an end to the traffic congestion in the city. 10 Cheetah Patrol Jeeps and 30 Bike Patrol troops were flagged off by the Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan in a function held in front of the Thampanoor Police Station.

The Cheetah Vehicle Patrol aims at reducing the road accidents and to get rid of the traffic congestion in the City. The State Police Chief Loknath Behera had announced the introduction of Cheetah Vehicle patrol during the meeting convened on November 24, 2019, to discuss about the solutions for reducing traffic congestion in the City.

The Cheetah 1 will operate at Kazhakootam and Thumba areas. The Cheetah 2 concentrates at Medical College and Sreekaryam, Cheetah 3 at Mannanthala and Peroorkada regions. Cheetah 4 is deputed for reducing traffic congestion at Vattiyoorkkavu and Poojapura, Cheetah 5 at Museum and Cantonment regions. Cheetah 6 is responsible for reducing traffic congestion at Fort and Thampanoor, Cheetah 7 at Nemom and Karamana areas. Cheetah 8 operates at Pettah and Vanchiyoore regions. Cheetah 9 is nominated in Poonthura and Valiyathura regions and Cheetah 10 will operate at Vizhinjam, Kovalam and Thiruvallam regions.

The Cheetah Vehicle Patrol groups are responsible for curbing traffic violations, traffic congestion, taking necessary steps for reducing road accidents, reporting the various potholes on the road, finding trees and electric poles lean over the road and reporting to the higher authority for taking necessary action.
